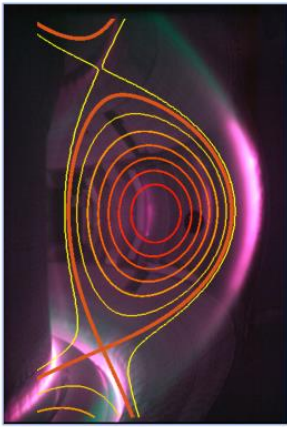
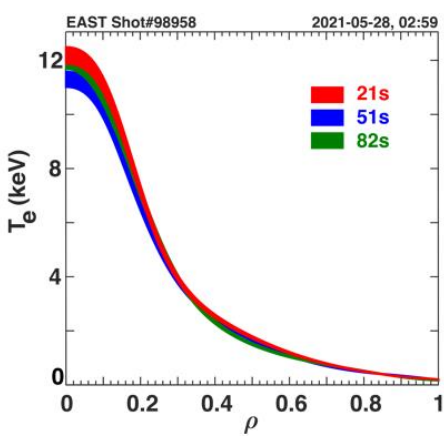
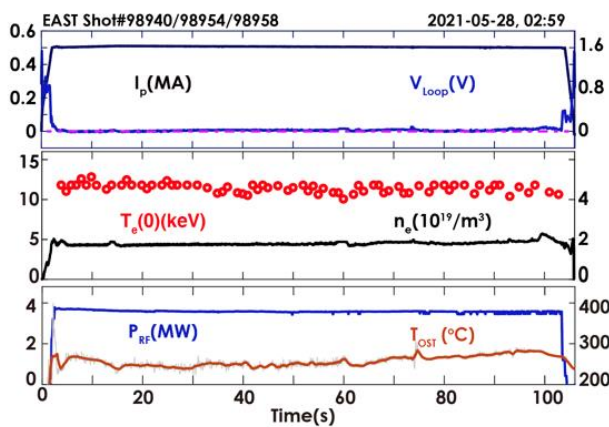


The Science Island Express delivers the most recent big things happening at HFIPS.

EAST reached another milestone in its advancement by achieving a plasma temperature of 120 million degrees Celsius for a period of 101 seconds in its latest experiment on last Friday and a plasma temperature of 160 million degrees Celsius lasting for 20 seconds was also realized.
